A FRIEND OF BOXING.

Sonator Frawley of New York to Introduce Bill to Help Game.

Albany, N. Y., Jan. 22.—Senator Fraw-ley, the father of the hoxing bill consid-ered in the legislature last year, has of-fored the upper house a bill permitting amateur boxing matches to be conducted under the supervision of the Amateur Athletic league. The rules of this organization are to govern all bouts, which must be pulled off, according to Senator Frawley's scheme, in the clubs of members of the athletic associations belonging to the league. Only four three-minute bouts will be allowed.

The New York senator said in discuss-ing his bill: "The advocates of the healthy sport of boxing intended this year to concentrate all their energies on this amateur boxing bill. These canals were built during the Dutch occupation of the fertile island, and some of them are 250 years old. The last one was dug 110 years ago. There are altogether 163 miles of navigable canals constructed by the industrious and commerce loving Netherlanders. These old canals have been kept in excellent order, and they have held their own against all the efforts of modern ways of transportation to abolish them. They are navigated by native flat bottomed boats of light draft, and the Cingalese boatmen are almost as picturesque as the Venetian gondoliers.
