LAST FIGHT," SAYS GANS

LASI FIGH!," SATS GANS San Francisco, Sept. 9.—For the third time within two years Battling Nelson, the lightweight champion, and Joe Gans, who held the title for over six years, are to meet this afternoon in the Mis-sion street arena in a contest scheduled to go 45 rounds. Up to the moment the gong clangs at 2:30 p.m., the odds are expected to remain about stationary at the closing quotations of last night, when Nelson ruled a 2 to 1 favorite. Nelson spent the evening at his train-ing quarters, in conpany with his fath-er, his manager and some friends and Gans attended a performance at an Oak-land theater. The process of weighing in at 2 oclock toay is expected to be lit-tile more than a formality, as both men are said to be within easy striking dis-tance of the 132 pound mark. "Nelson sylin have as his adviser and chief second Willus Britt and the fol-lowing as assistants: Chief Grace, Jeff Perry, Red Cornet and "Mike the Turk." Benny Selig will advise Gans, who will have as seconds Frank McDonald, Ed-die Hanon and Johnny Murphy. "In a statement given out on the eve of battle Nelson asserts his intention of going after Gans as he has previously done and declares it will be simply a action of how long Gans can last. He declares that he is n better shape than ever before and that Gans has been given this opportunity that the public might choose the master. "Gans lays his previous defeat to lack of condition, and asserts that he has this time trained faithfully. "I will fash as I never fought before," he promises. "and I will come back and win as I did angines. Mike (Twin) Sullvan. George McFadden and Frank Erne. If I lose this will probably be my last fight."
