

## TELEGRAPHIC. THE BOND CONTRACT.

Agreement Between Secretary Carlile  
and the Bankers.

### CONDITIONS OF THE PURCHASE

One Is That the Bankers Shall Exhibit  
Themselves to Protect the Treasury  
From Gold Withdrawals.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 13.—The full text of the bond contract is as follows:

This agreement entered into this 13th day of February, 1895, between the secretary of the treasury of the United States of the first part and Messrs. August Belmont & Co., of New York, on behalf of Messrs. N. G. Schenck, & Sons, of London, England, and themselves, and Messrs. J. H. Morgan & Co., of New York, on behalf of Messrs. J. H. Morgan & Co., of London, and themselves, parties of the second part, witnesseth:

Whereas it is provided by the second section of the United States (section 10) that the secretary of the treasury may purchase coin with any of the bonds or notes of the United States authorized by law as sum or sums and terms as he may deem most advantageous to the public service; and whereas the secretary of the treasury now deems that an emergency exists within which the public interest requires that an interim loan, same shall be purchased with the bonds of the United States of the amount of \$100,000,000, and the same may be paid in gold coin at the rate of \$125.00 per ounce payable in United States registered bonds, said bonds to be dated February 1, 1895, and payable at the place of payment, and the interest thereon to be calculated at six percent per annum from the date of the date of the act of Congress of July 24, 1890, until the 1st of March next, and thereafter at the rate of four percent per annum.

Now, therefore, the said parties of the second part hereby agree to sell and deliver to the United States \$3,000,000 worth of gold coin, and to pay the United States at the rate of \$125.00 per ounce payable in United States registered bonds, said bonds to be dated February 1, 1895, and payable at the place of payment, and the interest thereon to be calculated at six percent per annum from the date of the date of the act of Congress of July 24, 1890, until the 1st of March next, and thereafter at the rate of four percent per annum.

First—Each purchase and sale of gold coin to be made on the following conditions:

CHICAGO, Feb. 13.—The second annual banquet of the Associated Press was held tonight at the Grand Pacific hotel. Furthermore the parties of the second part and their nominees hereunder assume and will incur all the expense and inevitable loss resulting from the exercise of their rights, with the exception of the financial influence and will make all legitimate efforts to protect the treasury of the United States against withdrawal and/or spending the complete proceeds of the bonds.

PROGRESS OF THE WAR.

Advices From Yokohama By A. L. STEPHENS.

YOKOHAMA, Feb. 13.—The armistice of China arrived this morning with Yokohama's sanction. The start of the Japanese military expedition was launched January 16, by the first detachment of the newly organized army corps called "Takao," under command of General Takiyama. This corps had been organized with 10,000 men, and was divided into three divisions of 3,000 each. The infantry landed and advanced the same night Yangtze River, about twenty miles from the coast and about twenty-five miles east of Wei-Hai-Wei. On January 18, the Japanese advanced westward, and on January 20, reached the mouth of Yangtze River, and the advance of the corps was distributed between that point and the British port of Kowloon.

At the same time, General Takiyama was treated with great courtesy during his stay at Taku and Kowloon.

The Chinese generals are striving to dislodge Japanese troops. Roberts' forces advanced position at Haikou, with greater power than before. At first the Japanese had a slight advantage, but after a few days they were equal, and starting.
