Discovery of an Immense Silver-bearing Rock

NEAR STEPHENSPARK SPRINGS, COLO.

Denver, Colo., July 3.—A special train from Steamboat Springs, Colo., arrived here today with the discovery of an immense silver-bearing rock, said to have some 500,000 tons. This is said to be the largest silver-bearing rock in the world. There are already four or five hundred men on the ground and hundreds of claims have been staked.
