LOCAL NEWS.

The Kanab Washout.—By telegram just received from Kanab we learn that the field dam at that place was not only entirely washed away by the recent freshet, but the channel at that point was gullied out ten feet deeper than it was before, which makes it fifty feet in depth. The work of building another dam has not yet been commenced, and it will not be until the hammer and other necessary tools for the construction of a pile driver can be procured in this city and shipped down there to use on the job.

Petty Stealing.—Some small-souled individual is engaged in the despicable business of stealing garden plants in this city, several cases of loss in this line having been lately reported to us. In the last instance heard of, a lady in the 7th ward had a number of choice bulbs and other flowering plants pilfered from her garden, the tracks left by the thief indicating that he had been in his stocking shoes. A search of the beautiful flowers in general is commendable, but when it seeks such means of gratification as this it ought to be repressed by the person in whom it develops being required to engage in the more honorable, but less aesthetically business of shoveling gravel for the improvement of public roads with his pedal extremities adorned by a ball and chain for about a month.

Treseder's Bonds Forfeited.—This morning at 11 o'clock the time set for the arraignment of Frank Treseder in the Third District Court. Upon his name being called no answer was made, and the names of the bondsmen, T. J. Steed, C. H. Crow and Alma Pratt, were not shouted by the clerk. The bonds declared forfeited. Mr. Grande Young stated that while he was not the attorney for Treseder, he had been informed that the bondsmen expected to produce him some time today, and as they had not yet had sufficient time, asked that the forfeiture of the bonds be deferred. This Mr. Dickson objected to, and demanded that the bail be forfeited at once, and the Court so ordered.

Lecture in Social Hall.—A very interesting lecture will be delivered in the Social Hall on Thursday next by Julius Debricke, the well known Australian traveler. Mr. Debricke has been twice a member of government exploring expeditions, both times crossing the continent of Australia, of which he is now a citizen as yet, and it is his first journey through Central Australia. The learned speaker will lecture upon on Thursday next. The net receipts of the lecture are to be devoted to the relief of the poor, deaf and mute. There has been formed for the occasion a committee of some twenty of the most prominent citizens here, which we shall name in full in our to-morrow's issue. Considering the rare opportunity of getting new and interesting information not to be obtained elsewhere, and further, the benevolent purpose, there can be no doubt as to a well filled auditorium.

The "Dude" Robbers.—Four stylishly dressed individuals, who would figure as fast young men, from their appearance, were ushered before Justice Pyper this morning with doubtful countenances, and listened to the reading of a complaint charging them with the offense of robbery, committed on Friday night at the establishment of Sadie Noble. The four were J. B. Hart, J. B. Hastings, J. B. Kellogg and F. H. Loomis. Hastings and Kellogg were the two arrested at Farmington Saturday afternoon, and Loomis was arrested at Cedar Breaks, being the person who drove the conveyance by which the others traveled. The defendants stated that they desired time in which to procure counsel, and Justice Pyper set Wednesday at 10 o'clock a. m., as the hour at which the preliminary examination would take place, to determine whether or not the accused should be held to answer to the grand jury. Loomis protested that he was asleep in a hotel at the time the robbery was committed, but his subsequent association with the other parties was probably made to be explained at the examination.

SEVIER STAKE.

THE IMPROVEMENTS AND FUTURE PROSPECTS OF THAT FRUITFUL REGION.

Our friend, W. H. Seegmiller, of the Presidency of the Sevier Stake, is in town, and is busy sipping for news from that region, resulting in our eliciting from him a few facts that will probably interest our readers.

Sevier Valley is a most peculiar place. Situated in the midst of a country that seldom escapes the usual snow fall and frost incidental to such altitude and latitude, it enjoys a most remarkable exemption from these wintry visitations, that we have never yet found anyone capable of explaining the reason of. Naturally, Sevier Valley is perhaps the driest part of Utah. Much of the soil there appears never to have been soaked with water; especially is this the case with the bench land that slopes gently down from the mountains on either side of the valley towards the river. When canals and water ditches are made to convey the irrigating fluid over such land in that valley the inhabitants always calculate on the land settling, as the water is made to flow over and soak into it, from one to three feet in depth. This results in the great inconveniences in the contour of the country, owing to some patches getting soaked and settling sooner than others, but it gradually assumes a more level appearance as the soaking becomes general. But little snow falls in the valley and the frost is seldom severe, so that outdoor work may be carried on without inconvenience all winter long. In fact, winter is the principal season for building houses and constructing canals and roads in that part.

During the past winter a good deal of work of this character has been accomplished: in fact, during the months of January and February the weather was so fine that a great deal of work was done also, and a large breadth of barley was sown.

One canal which branches off from the river at Joseph City, and which is towed to Willow Creek, a point about ten miles south of Big Water, has been worked upon all winter, and is now almost completed to Elsinore where it will be utilized during the coming season in irrigating about 1,000 acres of the excellent bench land situated between that settlement and the foothills. It will probably not be completed to Willow Creek before a year from now. When it is, several thousand acres of the very best land in the valley will be brought under cultivation by it.

Another canal extending from a point on the river immediately east of Richmond to Redmond, the northernmost settlement of the county, has also been the scene of a large amount of labor during the past winter. It is now completed to Vermilion, about ten miles north of Big Water.

When these two canals are finished it is expected that ample facilities will be provided for the many young people of the county to branch out, for themselves, and also room afforded for a good many new comers to obtain excellent farms.

In the settlement of Sevier Valley the poorest land was taken up first, because it happened to be the most accessible to water, but now that the water is being conveyed to the bench land much of the bottom land taken up first is being converted into meadows and pastures, for which it is better adapted than for tillage.

Sevier Valley really one of the most desirable locations in the Territory. The cultivated land yields abundantly of the various kinds of cereals and roots, and it is also well adapted for the raising of fruit of all kinds that flourish in these northern regions, while the surrounding hills and mountains afford an excellent range for cattle, horses and sheep, to the entire of which the people of that region devote a good deal of attention. The horses, especially of that county, are noted for being among the best raised in the Territory. Brother Joseph A. Young many years ago introduced some excellent blooded animals into that country, the products of which have now become pretty generally scattered among the various settlements, and the start towards grading up the native horses then made has been followed up by the importation of Hambletonians, Lexingtons and Normans, so that now some of the horses are declared to be at a discount there and are becoming every year more scarce. The sheep herds, of which there are quite a number, are also being graded up by keeping only Merino bucks, and have already attained a goodly degree of perfection. In addition to the good strains of horned stock raised in the county in the past, a number of Holstein bulls and heifers have lately been purchased by stock owners in that region, and good results are anticipated from the crossing of them with other breeds as well as from propagating this special breed on the excellent range of that part.

In Rabbit and Grass Valleys, lying east of the Sevier, the snow has fallen to a much greater depth than usual the past winter, and as a result stock there are looking very thin, though few deaths are reported among them.

From Hennefer.—Brother Robert Jones, from Hennefer, Summit County, called upon us this morning and reported everything prosperous in the little settlement from which he hailed, and that he was the best in the county. Unlike most of the towns and villages of that region, its inhabitants are not devoted partially or wholly to coal mining, but follow agricultural pursuits instead, and their farming land being of a very good quality, especially for vegetables, and the range surrounding them being well adapted for the raising of cattle, they manage to do pretty well at it. While there are no in the settlement who are very rich, all are above want, those who are able to provide for themselves being well cared for by their more prosperous neighbors. Though the season there is rather later than in this valley, the people have already commenced their spring work.

Quite a number of improvements of the Hennefer private nature have been made there within the past year, among which may be mentioned the erection of a very good school house, which has just been completed, and is surrounded by a berry and supplied with a good water supply to the school children.

Eliaz Morris Arrested.—Early this morning Justice Pyper visited the residence of Mr. Eliaz Morris, the well known builder and contractor, and arrested that gentleman, and subpoenaed his family and a number of neighbors. The complaint against Mr. Morris alleges that from May 1, 1893, to April 1, 1895, he lived with and acknowledged as his wife Mrs. Eliaz Morris and Mrs. Mary Morris, contrary to section 2 of the Edmunds law, as interpreted by the courts. Mr. Morris was taken before Commissioner McKay, and there waived examination, his bonds being fixed at \$1,000, and that of each of the witnesses at \$500. Messrs. J. C. Cutler and A. B. Best becoming sureties.

Sent to Jail.—This morning the three boys—Charles Martini, Lucien Adams and Dan Henry—who were arrested for stealing some goods from a second-hand store, were brought before Justice Pyper, and admitted that the charge against them was true. They were each sentenced to sixty days' imprisonment.

Accidentally Shot.—We mentioned on Saturday that a sheepherder had been brought to this city from Idaho on Friday evening's U. C. train, dangerously wounded. The man's name is Franklin Harder, the accident occurred at Eagle Rock two weeks ago.

"Harder, according to his own statement, was out with an Indian shooting deer and had his gun run down in the sagebrush for the purpose of securing up some deer that were below a precipice on which Harder and the Indian were standing. The Indian pulled out his gun and fired at him, and he was doing so the trigger was caught in some way, and as the gun was pointed at his throat he instinctively thrust the muzzle to one side. But he was not quick enough, and the charge entered his left side, passed through his lung and came out near his spinal column. He remained in that position for some time without other assistance than that which the Indians could render, but was finally found and taken to Eagle Rock. His case being a critical one he was brought down for the purpose of going to the hospital in Salt Lake City."
