selves tentatively in favor of eliminat-ing this method of handling baggage. However, opposition to the plan has developed and a substitute plan has been considered.

The sub-stitute plan is to check baggage from a residence in Chicago, for instance to the railroad station at the point of destination instead of straight through to the residence or hotel to be occu-pied by the traveler, as can be done at present at present.

The eastern roads have not as yet taken any action regarding the present method and it is not believed they will, the agitation being confined entirely to the roads comprising the western association.
