SUGAR FACTORY

IN OPERATION.

Splendid Start Made in Season's Run—1,040 Tons Beets in Three Days.

RELIGION CLASS CONVENTION.

Ogden, Utah, Sept. 22.—The Amalgamated Sugar company's run at the Ogden factory this year promises to be very heavy as far as the daily output is concerned. The first sugar manufactured at the factory was placed on the market yesterday. The capacity of the Ogden factory is 800 tons of beets daily. The first day 800 tons were run through. The second day 800 tons and yesterday 1,040 tons of beets cut in three days. The farmers are slow this season in coming with the crops from the management of the Ogden factory has been very satisfactory. The beets have been received from the outlying districts and it is believed now that the farmers have practically harvested the beets will be sent to the factory to be processed.
