Ogden Junction, Sept. 17—

The reason why many of our box elder trees look so withered and decayed, is because the cutting men have laid their eggs in the bark, and every hole in the tree is filled with worms, some just hatched out, and others having laid away to form the chrysalis.

This morning Mr. Thos. Doxey showed us an old skirt which had been hung on a tree in his garden in every fold were worms which, after performing their work of destruction in the fruit, were now hiding away till their transformation into coding moths.

Mr. Doxey also showed us the wrappings which were placed around

the shade trees of the City Hall grounds in the spring. Every piece of cloth which was at all loose, contained a number of the many kinds of worms, and in every fold of a tree more of them were stored away.

A ten year old son of Jas. Shupe, of this city, met with a painful accident last evening. While in the lot of his father's barn, when he slipped through the floor, his right leg coming in contact with a sharp knot in the lumber, cutting a gash commencing at the ankle, going upward about six inches, and penetrating the leg 14 inches the entire length of the bone. The boy, bearing the painful operation with great fortitude, never murmuring once. No chloroform was used, the patient preferring to stand the pain without it.
