First District Court.

Judge King presided in the first district court yesterday.

Fred R. Smith, formerly editor of the Spanish Park Herald, now of Chicago, was arraigned on a charge of libel, consisting of publishing an article reflecting on the character of R. J. Stewart in the Herald last April. He pleaded not guilty.

Ed. Smith, the young Helen mentioned for rape committed at Payson about a week ago, entered a plea of not guilty. His bail, fixed at \$1,000, by Judge Merrill was raised to \$1,500.

Julian Jennings was arraigned on a charge of unlawfully breaking into a laundry, better known as the "Blue" on the 27th of September last. He pleaded not guilty.

New Cases Filed.

Peter Winward was convicted in Justice Wilson's court at Payson, of shooting James Reamy by using menacing, insulting, and obscene language. He was fined \$100 and costs, and has taken an appeal to the first district court.

Helen Butler has commenced suit against the trustees of the Salt Lake and Utah Northern and Great Salt Lake railways to obtain \$100,000. On the 26th of October, while she was crossing the track west of this city, a freight train came along and a collision resulted in the killing of the woman and the demoralizing of the engine. Her husband, James Butler, a personal injuries the above mentioned amount is asked. Plaintiff alleges negligence on the part of the railroad company in that they allowed weeds and willows to grow along the track on the street where plaintiff attempted to cross, which obstructed his view, and they had failed to ring a bell or blow a whistle.

It is a mistake idea that many have that they can influence the decision of the judge by talking to him of their past exploits and number of prizes they have taken. If a judge is an expert, he can readily see this and is naturally suspicious of one who talks too much in this line.

All exhibitors should remember that there is only one prize, and if they are not successful take their defeat gracefully and do not let it affect them. The judge's management and all the other exhibitors. I have seen men completely lose their heads and make statements that if they could hear in their animal's thoughts they would see how stupid they were.

The judge, if he is an expert, knows no one and gives the prize to the best animal, and if one man has the best individual in about all the classes he should get the prize. Many exhibitors cannot understand this and think that the judge should be more easily divided. This is a common idea among a large class of small exhibitors which you will find at almost every state and county fair.

While on the subject of fair I would like to call your attention to the prize for bulls. I think it is of very little value unless all good bulls are judged with their progeny, and in good grades are much more profitable to the exhibitor than a single bull. I could like to see a grade among the progeny. This is an old story with me, and one I have followed for many years, and I think all men who are interested and have followed the bull prize circuit may of our large fairs will agree with me in this subject.—B.
