

The commission report, as their conclusion from the evidence given and from their own observation, that a part of the force now en-ployed in the rervice are to ident in proper attention to business as well as in business qualifications and integrity of character. A few of them are employed more or less in private business, to the possible detriment, in some cases, of the in-terests of the service, and that some fraudulently accept moneys for ser-vices rendered in their official ca-The commission think the pro-posed reduction of the force should be made in various divisions and

classes, after a careful scrutiny and examination in each division, in such a manner as the wisdom of the Department may determine, to the end that the government may retain the most faithful and efficient of its present officials. Men are appointed to positions requiring often the skill and experience of experts, generally at the request of politicians and political associa-tions, in this and other States, with little or no examination into the fitness of the appointees, beyond the recommendation of their friends. This is unsound in principle, dangerous in practice, demoralizing in its influence, and calculated to encourage and perpetuate official ignorance, inefficiency, and corruption. There can be no ade-quate protection in the customs service for the honor of government rights, of importers, and the inter-ests of a nation until the service is freed from the control of party, and organized on a strictly business basis, with some guarantees for efficiency, and finally in the selection of chief and subordinate officers that would be required by a prudent merchant.
