less carbonaceous, less warming; send

from the table the pork and bacon, and

fat meats, oils, and sugars, and starches,

and sago, and the tapioca pudding, and

the puddings, and the rich pastries;

get hold of the early "greens," the spin-

ach, the salads, the turnip tops, the

radish, the early berry and the daily

attention to the cleanliness of the skin,

be more in the air; sleep in better ven-

tilated rooms, let your windows be

raised high at night and your inner

doors left wide open.—Dr. Hall.

LONDON.—The English Census Bu-

reau have just completed a revision of

the latest (1871) census of London. It

shows a total population of 3,254,260.

This is three times as great as the popu-

lation of London seventy years ago.

For the thirty years last past the in-

crease has been regularly 40,000 a year,

or 1,200,000. The area covered by the

city is 78,000 acres, or exactly 123 square

miles, which makes a tract eleven miles

by eleven miles, with one square mile

over. The present growth of London is

said to be more rapid than at any past

period in its history. A wall to enclose

such a city would have to be (if square)

nearly forty-five miles in extent, which

is fifteen miles less than the historical

account of the extent of the walls of

Babylon. London is not very densely

inhabited compared with some of our

crowded American cities. It contains

only forty-two persons to the acre. New

York must contain at least twice as

many. Liverpool has 100.
