

## MOTHER DROWNS HER FOUR CHILDREN

Shipwrecked at Sea, Captain's  
Wife Feared Few Survivors  
Would Feed Upon Them.

### SHE SHARED THEIR FATE.

Five Out of Crew of Twenty-Two  
Survived—One of Them Tells Tale  
Of Their Suffering.

Victoria, B. C., Aug. 24.—Few more tragic tales of the sea are on record than that brought today by the steamer Makura, from Australia, of the wreck of the Norwegian bark Errol, which struck Middleton reef June 18.

Five remained of 22 when the steamer Tofu took them off, so emaciated from thirst and starvation that they had to be carried.

The Makura brought a detailed account of their vain effort to find water on the reef, their unsuccessful search for a cache of provisions and a lifeboat maintained there previous to 1882, and which the sailing directions stated still existed, of their final abandonment of hope and subsequent cannibalism. Captain Anderson and the second mate were drowned while building a raft. Anderson's wife and children looked on, wringing their hands, and finally, after others had succumbed and the remainder were weak from starvation, the captain's wife drowned her four children in the impression that the five survivors were planning to resort to cannibalism. She followed the children into the waves.

The five survivors were too far gone to talk much of their sufferings. Patrick Palmer, an American, who joined the ship at Coquimbó, said:

"Five of us got away on a raft. We went all over the reef in search of water, but found none, and one of the party died on the reef. We had some difficulty in building the raft and the captain and second mate both were drowned. The captain's wife stood with a few of him watching him, and she saw him drown as she stood there wringing her hands; she had her four children, aged 1 to 8, standing beside her."

"We thought we would be able to find water on the reef and save the lives of those we had left and the wreck, but those sailing directions lie. There was water there, there was a life boat and food, and there was no food and no life boat. One died, he fell down on the reef and drowned his head on his chest. He was lucky."

"There was another wreck on the reef and we thought it was a store ship. We boarded it. It was nothing to eat. It was mostly old and all it held was a bottle with about two gills of water that must have been there for years by the horrible taste of it. I and the carpenter drank it. We afterward found some more water and although it was bad, we drank it. We then decided to build a punt from the wreckage, and while we were working on this we lived on shellfish."

Another survivor took up the story. He said that when the survivors were sitting on the sand the captain's wife thought they were considering cannibalism and she asked them not to eat her children. Her mind was gone. Suddenly she ran into the sea and drowned her four children, following them into the sea. When relief finally came there were but five, four men and a boy. And these were so exhausted that they had to be carried by the rescuers.

The steamer Tofu was bound from the islands to San Francisco, and wrecks were seen at Middleton reef, where formerly there had been but one. The steamer bore in and sent boats ashore. One of the wrecks was near the punt built by the survivors, who hysterically seized the jugs of weakened brandy and beef tea passed to them.

The bridge is to cost \$50,000, of which the government will give \$5,000 and the Arizona territorial and county authorities \$40,000.

The Indians will make their contribution in working. Mr. Hurd says they are showing a great willingness to do their share and seem to appreciate that the bridge will be of much benefit to them proportionately as to the whites.

ANOTHER PEACE FLEET  
TO CROSS THE PACIFIC

Washington, Aug. 25.—Another "peace" fleet is to be sent across the Pacific by the United States, will comprise eight of the strongest and fastest cruisers in the naval force and will leave San Francisco a week from next Sunday. It will be occupied with its mission, which is declared to be friendly, more than five months.

The vessels which have been ordered to prepare for the journey are the fully armed cruisers, California, Oregon, South Dakota, Washington, West Virginia, Maryland and Pennsylvania.

According to the navy department's schedule of their 25,000-mile journey, after making several side trips to Chinese and Japanese ports, the whole squadron will re-assemble at Yokohama and will sail for home Jan. 19, 1910.

New York, Aug. 25.—The peculiar effect of a severe electric shock has been noted by the surgeons of Flower hospital in the case of Ebenezer Steele, an Armenian, who came in contact with a dynamo. Although Steele partly recovered consciousness the rigidity remained.

## SANTA FE FREIGHT TRAIN RUNS AWAY

At Mojave Collided With Switch Engine, Piling Up Wreckage, Killing Two Persons, Injuring Six.

Bakersfield, Cal., Aug. 25.—Two trainmen were killed and six persons were injured early today when an eastbound Santa Fe freight train of 47 cars got beyond control of the crew at Warren, five miles west of Mojave, and ran away down the grade. At Mojave the train collided with a switch engine and 33 cars and the engine were piled up in a hopeless wreck at the west end of the yard.

The dead are L. W. Harris and R. R. Roth, both brakemen on the runaway train.

The injured are Engineer Magee of the runaway train, probably fatally; W. B. Mulloy, brakeman, and M. Shelton, switch engineer and three others whose names are unknown.

When the runaway train reached Mojave it had attained a velocity of between 35 and 40 miles an hour. At the lower end of the yard a switch engine was operating and the collision that resulted threw the entire train except eight cars from the track. Tail-rod officials expect to have the road open for traffic by 2 o'clock or shortly after today.

The quake was felt most severely within a radius of 207 miles from Siena. Considerable damage was done at Buonconvento. Several houses collapsed and one person was killed. Several persons were injured at Monteroni.
