At her residence in the 16th Ward: Sister ELIZABETH J. MATTHEWS, in her 48th year, from rheumatic fever. She lived a Saint and died in the full hope of a glorious resurrection.

In this city December 6th 1881, of congestion of the lungs, WILLIAM EVANS, son of Herbert and Mary Van Dam, aged one year, 9 months and 11 days.

At the residence of Mrs M. F. G. Morrison, Mount Pleasant, Sanpete County, December 3d, 1881, CHARLOTTE S. HYDE, wife of Apostle Orson Hyde, aged 79 years, 3 months and 11 days.

Sister Hyde was born August 22d, 1802, at Lowerpensneck, Salem County, New Jersey. Joined the church in St. Louis, Mo.; was baptized by Elder Edson Whipple in 1850; and came to Utah in 1852.

In the spring of 1858 she left her comfortable home in the 12th Ward, Salt Lake City, during the exodus of the Saints from there, and arrived in Ephraim, Sanpete County, where she lived one year, and at the organization of Mount Pleasant in the spring of 1859, moved there and remained there ever since.

Sister Hyde has lived an exemplary life, been a true and faithful Latter-day Saint, always trying to do good wherever she had an opportunity.

She taught school in Mt. Pleasant over 21 years, and was faithful in the discharge of her duties. She took great pleasure in cultivating the minds of the young who were entrusted to her care, and instructing them in the principles of life and salvation.

Everyone loved and respected Aunt Hyde, as she was generally called, and her name will be held with honor and respect while memory lasts. She bore the cross like a true Saint, and will ultimately wear the crown. M. F. C. MORRISON.

In the 14th Ward, December 4th, 1881, of congestion of the brain, JOHN, son of John and Helen M. Morgan, aged eleven months.

At his residence in Provo City, Monday, November 28th, 1881, at 8 a.m., GEORGE BEFRE.

Deceased was born August 6th, 1811, in Oneida County, New York, and was baptized into the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints by Elder Lyman Wight, in September, 1830. He was ordained an Elder under the hands of the late President George A. Smith on September 5th, 1848. Elder Beebe shared the trials and persecutions of the Saints in Missouri, was assaulted by the mob and left for dead, and was driven with the Saints from Nauvoo, after which he settled in Polk City, Iowa, where he kept an open house for the Elders traveling to and from their missions, as many in Utah can testify. He moved with his family to Utah in the Spring of 1876. On Thursday last he was attacked severely with pneumonia, from which he suffered until death ensued. He breathed his last at the time mentioned, surrounded by a grief-stricken family who are called to mourn the loss of an affectionate husband and father. On his death bed he bore a faithful testimony that Joseph Smith was a Prophet of God.—(COM.)

In the 4th Ward, at the residence of her son, C. P. Williams, SARAH WILLIAMS MUSE, N. aged 83 years, lacking 21 days. Deceased was born at Much Wenlock, Shropshire, England, January 1st, 1799, was baptized into the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints at Birmingham, England, in the year 1838.
