

TELEGRAPHIC. A FATAL COLLISION.

Five Persons Killed and Four Badly Injured in the Accident.

THREE BODIES WERE CREMATED.

The Wreck Caused, it is Said, by an Engineer and Conductor Mishearing Orders.

HEWSON, Wis., June 7.—Five men were instantly killed and four badly injured by a collision on the Omaha railroad, near Hudson Junction, this afternoon.

The dead are: E. S. Hard, laborer; Joseph Leightner, laborer; Thomas Kelly, laborer; Milton Swain, laborer; Herman Reby, fireman.

The first four named are of Eau Claire, Wis.

The injured are: Brogan, engineer, badly bruised and slightly injured; James Owen, engineer, slightly hurt; A. Battiseman, engineer, a pile driver of Menominee, Wis., leg badly fractured internally injured, and will probably die.

Frank Sawyer, laborer, Wis., forehead, badly injured internally. A way freight, westbound, was running at the rate of eighteen miles an hour when, upon hearing a short whistle, it came to a sudden stop.

The work train was the bounding car, in which were four men belonging to the work crew. They were not aware of their danger and were undoubtedly instantly killed. The car took fire and three bodies were buried in the wreck.

AT URBANA.

Investigation of the Killing Commenced by the Governor.

URBANA, O., June 7.—Sheriff McClain reached home on the Big Four train in Springfield this afternoon. He was met at the depot by Deputy Sheriff Kirby in a cab and was hurried to his mother's home.

Major Hanson writes card today. In it he commends McClain. He says that he was done by the sheriff to save Mitchell that could have been done, and that it more force had been used, men, woman and children would have been killed.

OLD MINER'S CONVENTION

Which interest manifested in the meeting.

Debate, June 7.—The great number of interstate responses now received daily assure immense attendance at the international gold mining convention, which will meet here July 8th.

Delegates have been appointed by 200 gold-miners and various organizations issued in the call for a number of states in all sections of the West. Every state west of the Mississippi will be represented by large delegations, while the great west coast and north interest in any department of mining has either selected delegates or has been invited to do so.

Some representation. Official delegates have been appointed from 197 states in Alaska and other territories. According to the list of representatives, which embraces state, county and municipal organizations, and all mining interests, the convention will be the largest ever held in this country.

The government has received assurance that it will be perfectly safe for the officers of the United States company to return home, and that the convention will be held in a peaceful manner.
