5th: Gotham's Mortality. People who have been poo-pooing the unhealthfolmess of New York, during the last six months, would do well to consider the mortality statistics for the half year which we publish to day. For the first half of 80, the deaths numbered 15,279; for the six months just ended, they number 18,590. This represents a rate of about 30 per 10,000 per an-num, an abnormally high average for any civilized community. The increase of deaths from contagious diseases is more alarming even than the aggregate mortality. Up to June 30, 1880, only two persons died from smallpox, while there were 259 deaths from the same cause during the half year just ended. There can be little doubt that the gross neglect of
