The Legislative Canvass.

The Utah Commission began the canvass of the Legislative vote yesterday. As they were compelled to wait until the Canvassing Board had canvassed the county and precinct votes, they have not as yet finished any one district.

In the Fourteenth Representative district, where Olson and Hatch were running, the returns show the following result thus far:

Rich county was the first one taken up by the canvassing board August 19, and it was soon disposed of. No precinct officers were voted for.

Salt Lake county followed next, and occupied most of the day. The votes cast in this city for E. M. Collins, the "Liberal" candidate for county school superintendent, were not counted because the law forbids the voters of an incorporated city which comprises a school district from taking part in the election of that officer. This gives Allen, the Democratic candidate, an overwhelming majority.

The board decided that there was no vacancy in the office of justice of the
