The Howard report a large in-

crease in the number of cases of

the disease. The weekly mortality

report ending Sunday at 8 p.m.

shows 404 of yellow fever, 500

of which were reported on Sun-

day. The disease is reported to

be spreading rapidly.

Weather cloudy and threatening.

From noon to 6 p.m. 10 deaths were

reported to the board of health.

The total number of cases from

fever to date is 1,091, including 40

children 15 years of age. The new

cases include Willie K. Wolf and

Robert Parsons of the Telegraph
