A GROUP OF UNION PACIFIC SURVEYORS TAKEN IN 1868.

Above is a photograph of a group of Union Pacific surveyors taken by Savage in the summer of 1868 in this city, and who did good service in laying out the lines over which the trains have run ever since. The photograph from which this halftone is made is the property of Engineer H. M. McCartney of the Los Angeles road, and was recently sent to him by Major General Grenville M. Dodge, who, in 1868, was chief engineer of the Union Pacific road, and of course the commanding officer of this party of surveyors. The general sent the picture principally with a view to identifying the different members of the party, as Mr. McCartney was here at the time, and shortly after the photo was taken, joined the party himself. Mr. McCartney is able to present to identify only a part of the members of the group, and suggests a prize guessing party to supply the names of those he has forgotten. Beginning with the top row, the second man from the left is Jesse Corbus of Pennsylvania; 3 is Walter Wyckoff, brother of General Wyckoff, who was killed in the Spanish war; 6 is R. W. Fulton of Pennsylvania; 7 is W. M. Brown of this city, and now in the employ of the Short Line at the city depot. Of the middle row, No. 1 is L. E. Ricksocker, county surveyor at Santa Rosa, Cal.; 2 was Thomas B. Morris; and 3 was Howard L. Koons, both of Philadelphia, and since deceased. In the lower row, No. 3 is J. James Larkin of Kaysville. Koons died up in Oregon, where he got overheated one day, and then loaded up on cold water. His stay on earth after that performance was very short. Mr. McCartney will be glad to hear from anyone who can identify Nos. 1, 4 and 5 on the top row, and 1, 2, 4, 5 and 6 on the lower row, so that he can inform General Dodge. The general, although nearly 80 years old, is as lively and active as ever, and as deeply interested in western matters as when in service out here. He has a large number of western views in a great portfolio, and takes pride in showing them to his friends. He commanded a division under General Sherman on the march to the sea, and in engineering circles has been prominent for half a century.
