

GROCE AND CANNON HELD COMMISSIONS

In Nicaraguan Revolutionary
Army According to Private Ad-
vices From Bluefields.

REVOLUTION IS SPREADING

Insurgents Receiving Arms and Am-
munition and Americans Are
Aiding Them.

Washington, Nov. 25.—Groce and Cannon, the two Americans executed by order of President Zelaya of Nicaragua last week, held commissions in the insurgent army, according to private advices received tonight from Bluefields, where the revolutionist government is located. The dispatch

stated that the state department of the United States had been notified to this effect.

The state department has been anxious to clear up the point whether the two men had commissions or were merely acting in their individual capacities, for in the former event they would have been entitled to treatment as prisoners of war.

The revolution in Nicaragua is spreading, in the opinion of Capt. Shirley, commander of the United States cruiser Des Moines, which is off the east coast of Nicaragua. The revolutionary forces are reported to be maintaining an effective blockade and are patrolling off Greytown with two gunboats. Assurance was given that American and foreign interests are being protected.

These are the important facts contained in a cablegram received at the state department today from the commander of the Des Moines at Port Limon. On Nov. 22 the revolutionary gunboat fired on Greytown, but without effect. The revolutionary forces now have possession of the back country of Nicaragua, including Rama, where fighting is likely to occur. An officer from the Des Moines landed at Greytown, but found only one American citizen.

The state department was advised by the Western Union Telegraph company that, in the present interruption to lines in Nicaragua and Costa Rica, it is possible to handle some of the messages by wireless via Colon, but that the service is not continuous. There was no communication between

The message was signed "Sub-Secretary of State Moreira." It is assumed that he is an insurrectionist. It was stated that the department would not reply to Moreira.

AMERICANS ARE AIDING
NICARAGUAN INSURGENTS

Bluefield, Nicaragua, Nov. 25.—The Norwegian steamship Ulfstein arrived this morning from New Orleans with 2,000 Mauser rifles, 250,000 rounds of ammunition and several

pieces of light artillery for the revolutionists. The steamer also brought several Americans to operate the guns. In an interview today, Gen. Chamorro, revolutionary leader, said that Groce and Cannon, the Americans, were captured by Gen. Toledo near Greytown, and Zelaya ordered them shot. Toledo refused to obey the order, but had them placed in the front ranks where they were open to Gen. Chamorro's attack. They were killed and subsequently were sent to a dungeon in El Castillo fort. Gen. Chamorro says he knows nothing further regarding Groce and Cannon. Chamorro declares the blockade of Greytown is effective by sea and land and is confident that troops of President Zelaya soon will give in. He will leave tonight for Greytown with 300 recruits and a party of sharpshooters. Conditions here are quite.

The passengers were perplexed for a few minutes but soon they entered into the spirit of the occasion and gave the young couple cheers and good wishes.

THE DIVORCE EVIL.

Justice Brewer Condemns Publication
Of Proceedings in Public Press.

New York, Nov. 25.—Justice David Brewer of the United States supreme court, censured yellow journalism in the course of a lecture before the Progress club at Park Rockway. He spoke on the topic "A Good Time Coming." "The publication of testimony in the yellow journals," he declared, "particularly in regard to divorce cases, is to be deplored. Such publication does not help the cases, and it drags into the public eye family skeletons that had better be left in their closets. Publication of such stuff simply feeds the morbid interest, and exerts everything except a healthful influence. In many cases where such matter is published people go to the bad who would otherwise resume the strict and narrow path and when they do to the bad as a result of such publications they rarely ever recover their lost standing and their desire to be proper citizens. "We shall only have good times when the people of the entire world cease strife."

CHICAGO SOON TO HAVE NEW LIGHTING SYSTEM

Chicago, Nov. 25.—Official action toward the consummation of the proposed new lighting system for the city, under which it is planned to have every street in Chicago lighted with electricity furnished by the drainage canal, was begun yesterday by Chairman Snow of the council finance committee. In a letter addressed to President McCormick of the sanitary district, Mr. Snow asked that a committee from the drainage board be appointed to meet with the finance committee and endeavor to work out some plan under which a system can be financed by the drainage board.

After sending the letter to Mr. McCormick, Alderman Snow said that in event no arrangements could be made with the drainage board to finance the proposition, the voters at the coming spring election will be asked to approve a bond issue of from \$2,000,000 to \$2,500,000 to construct the system desired.
