

## T&EOPAH WILL GET A RAILROAD

Promoters of Los Angeles Line  
Getting Down to Business.

### BONDS HAVE BEEN PLACED

Freight to the Amount of 1,000 Tons  
A Day Has Also Been Promised  
The Promoters.

Tonopah is now revelling in a railroad boom with indications that that famous Nevada mining camp will hear the whistle of the iron horse within the next 18 months. While there are several projects on foot it begins to look as though the Los Angeles, Daggett & Tonopah railroad will be the line that will go through. The promoters of this scheme have already secured the promise of 1,000 tons of freight a day that will produce an income of \$10,000 daily, to say nothing of passenger traffic, switch charges and other sources of income that the railroad obtains. The first mortgage bonds that have been issued have also all been disposed of the things generally look rosy for J. Irving Crowell, the president, and his associates.

Such in brief is the news that was brought to this city by C. L. Hansen, one of the main promoters of the new road, who was in Salt Lake for a few hours on Saturday in his way home from the East.

In course of conversation with the "News" he stated that a force of surveyors was now at work on both ends of the proposed line and they are rushing things as fast as circumstances will permit. He stated that the proposed route of the line lies through the Panamint range through Death Valley, to Leider Valley, thence via Silver Peak to Tonopah, passing through a number of mining camps that will undoubtedly develop into big propositions with the advent of the railroad. In all the new road will be about 300 miles in length.

### MITCHELL REINSTATED.

Agent at Thistle Gets His Old Job Back Again—Other Appointments.

W. H. Mitchell, who for a number of years was agent at Thistle Junction and who was asked to resign about three months ago, has been reinstated. It will be recalled that Mitchell declined to break one of the rules of the O. R. T., whereupon he was discharged. Mitchell went to Denver and laid his case before the order with such effect that the matter was turned over to General Superintendent Young decided to give the old-time employee his old position again. M. W. Bird, who took Mitchell's place at Thistle, has returned to his old job in Springville. C. A. Storrs, agent at Gunnison, has been promoted to Agent at American Fork, vice N. G. Merrill who has sold land in the valley. But for some time past to come will be in the employ of the Northern Pacific. Another change that has been announced is the appointment of F. H. Barry as agent at Castle Gate, vice F. E. Ubil.

### WOOL BUYERS ARRIVING.

The advance guard of the wool buyers has arrived in town in the person of Harry Wood of C. J. Webb & Co., of Philadelphia, Mark Harris of Harris & Co., of St. Louis, and George Collier of Chicago & Cavalry, both of the City Club. The latter, former president of the "Pec-Wen" club, has arrived, it is expected that the wool buyer's social organization will be once more perfect. It is understood that John Strong, who balked the initiation ceremony last season, has already filed application and will be put through at a special session at the Knutson at an early date.

Ludwig Elseman has not yet arrived, but rumor hath it that he already has a scheme whereby the Elkins' bill can be checkmated. The proposition is being kindly taken to by the balance of the wool buyers. In brief it is that the railroads each appoint a special poker commission armed with the necessary authority. There will no mean a quiet little game wherein the railroads are barred from showing anything higher than a pair of sixes and further agree not to call any four flushes.

H. L. Anderson, chief clerk in the office of Supt. Park, of the Wyoming division of the Union Pacific, has been promoted to trainmaster of the trains directed in place of H. J. Roth, transferred to the western district.

While the Rio Grande officials professed indifference regarding any contemplated construction in southern Utah to tap the iron deposits and thence on towards southern California, the signs of the times point to their being "something doing" in that direction nevertheless.
