CUSTOM MILL AT ROUND MOUNTAIN

Preparatory Work Finished and Construction Will Soon be Under Way.

DEVELOPING WATER SUPPLY.

Plenty of Ore Available in Camp-Auto Trucks for Transportation.

Manager C. H. Nagro, who is personally conducting the operations at the new mill site of the Bould Mountain Reduction company, at Round Mountain, Nev., states that the excavating work for the foundation is now finished and everything is in readiness for construction upon the arrival of the lumber and machinery. There have been shipped from Denver and Salt Lake, and should be on the ground within a short time. The site of the new custom mill is on Shoshone creek, just a few hundred yards below the present Fairview mill.

DEVELOPING WATER SUPPLY.

While waiting for the machinery to arrive, manager Nagro is sinking a well which he intends to put down a sufficient depth to obtain the bedrock flow. This is a difficult task as much water is being encountered at a shallow depth and this interferes greatly with the work. In the event of the bedrock being suitable for the construction, Mr. Nagro will build a dam. This would enable him to collect the water and have a constant reserve supply, besides raising the water level to any required height.

NO LACK OF ORES.

We are ready to put the mill up in very short order as soon as the material arrives, but are now at the entire mercy of the transportation companies and we can only hope that there will be no untoward delays said Nagro. "When the mill is completed there will be no dearth of ores as we have always enough advance orders from the camp to insure continuous operation for some time.

AUTO TRUCKS FOR HAULAGE.

It is the intention of the management to put in two or three auto trucks to transport the ore from the mine to the mill. This will necessitate the building of a small road but can be easily accomplished and a grade obtained that will permit the hauling of from three to five tons at the rate of 12 miles an hour.

ON STOCK EXCHANGE.

Colorado the Feature on the Morning Call—Shows a Strong Advance.

Colorado was the strong feature on the morning call and was traded in heavily. From 2.30 on the regular call it gradually advanced and reached a high point of 2.42 at the close. A total of 4,800 shares changed hands and the stock closed in strong demand. Beck Tunnel was weaker at about the same figure as on Saturday's call, there being a tendency to short it. The majority of the sales were on the seller 30 days basis. Seven Troughs was active around 41 and showed a strong tendency toward the close. Two dollar Daly Judge sold at 4.50 and smaller sales in other stocks were recorded.

In the ranks of the unlisted stocks, Ohio Copper was the star and sold up to 2.30. Ohio Kentucky sold at 2.07 1/2, decided drop from the last sales. Standard Copper was bid in at 15 1/2@20 and Copper Glance at 12 1/4.
