**Blaine and Hendricks.**

**COLUMBUS, O., 13.—Mr. Blaine left**

**Lancaster a little after 9 o'clock for**

**Toledo via Columbus. Just as he**

**started the train going down the Ac-**

**cung Valley, carrying Mr. Hendricks,**

**the Democratic candidate for Vice-**

**President, arrived at Lancaster. The**

**crowd at the depot cheered Mr. Hen-**

**dricks when he appeared on the rear**

**of the platform and he returned**

**thanks in a very brief speech, in the**

**course of which he said: "If Ohio to-**

**morrow shall support the Democratic**

**cause, the fact is over, but if Ohio to-**

**morrow shall not do that, then in in-**

**flames and in blood the fight is to**

**the death." A Columbus ex-Govern-**

**or, Foster, Chairman of the Ohio**

**Republican State committee, and**

**commissioner Dudley, boarded Mr.**

**Blaine's car. There was a stop here**

**of over an hour, but the car was left**

**on the outskirts of the city, and did not**

**go into the depot at all.**

**Toledo, 12.—At Prospect, a small**

**station where a brief stop was made,**

**an interesting scene took place. Sev-**

**eral hundred people were assembled,**

**who cheered, shouted and waved their**

**hats and handkerchiefs when**

**Blaine appeared. While he was bow-**

**ing acknowledgments to the very old**

**men, veteran Republicans, who had**

**brought out to the depot to see him,**

**from the platform and went to meet**

**him. One of these was Robert Crat-**

**ch, formerly near Chambersburg, Pa., and**

**said to be 100 years and fifty days old.**

**He was a Lieutenant in the last war**

**with Great Britain, and was once in**

**command of Fort Erie. The other was**

**John Jones, a native of Wales, but a**

**resident of this country since 1848.**

**Both seemed to be well and strong,**

**and Blaine remarked afterwards that**

**they had grasped hands firmly. They both**

**assured him that they expected to see**

**him elected President, and he expressed**

**his gratification in receiving their**

**expressions. When this interview was**

**ended, Blaine stepped to the rear of the**

**people cheered and clamored for a**

**speech. Blaine said: I thank you,**

**my friends, for your kind reception.**

**This old gentleman with whom I have**

**just been talking, was born when I**

**was but three months of age, and he**

**has now about sixty million of**

**people. He was born when we had just**

**escaped from colonial dependence, and**

**he has since seen this nation rise to the**

**leading nations of the world. If we**

**desire to keep it up, let us maintain**

**these principles on which alone a true**

**republic can rest.**

**The next stop was made at Marion,**

**Blaine made a few words of thanks**

**and encouragement.**

**At Upper Sandusky the people de-**

**clared a speech. Blaine said: I thank**

**you, my friends, for your kind recep-**

**tion. A speech on political topics is too**

**long for me to make here. I have to-**

**morrow I go to proclaim the result**

**of the presidential election. I hope the**

**republicans of the State are ready for**

**the trial.**

**At 4.40 the train reached Toledo, and**

**Blaine and party were driven quickly to**

**the hotel. To-morrow Blaine goes to**

**Detroit.**

**COLUMBUS, O., 13.—A citizens' meet-**

**ing was held to-day, at which a**

**joint committee appointed by Cleve-**

**land and Hendricks, clubs, and by re-**

**publican executive to committee to**

**decide to appoint four citizens, two**

**of each party, for each precinct in the**

**city. It is believed that the commit-**

**tees will be appointed to-day, and that**

**the election will be held in the**

**afternoon of to-morrow.**
