Arthur Hoskin, professor of mineralogy in the Colorado school of mines,





who was injured in a Grand Junction yesterday afternoon, was brought to Salt Lake and placed in St. Mark's hospital. The accident occurred during the switching about the Grand Junction yards of a train which crashed into the coaches which Prof. Hoskin and a party of students of the Colorado school of mines were occupying on a visit to the mines of Utah and Montana. The cars conveying the party were standing on a side track without an engine when the collision occurred, and Prof. Hoskin was the only occupant of the forward tourist sleeper at the time. Reports from the hospital today state

that Prof. Hoskin's injuries are not serious, and that he will soon recover from the shock of the collision.
