draft animals or any other vehicles the person so operating such motor ve-hicle shall seasonably turn the same hicle shall seasonably turn the same to the right of the center of such highway so as to pass without inter-ference. Any such person so operating any such vehicle shall, on overtaking any such vehicle, draft animal or other vehicle, pass on the left side thereof, and the rider or driver of such horse, soon as practicable, turn to the right so as to allow free passage on the left. Any such person so operating a motor vehicle shall at the intersection of public highways, keep on the right of public highways, keep on the right of the intersection of the centers of such highways when turning to the right, and pass to the right of such Intersection when turning to the left Nothing in this subdivision shall, how-ever, be construed as limiting the meaning or effect of the provisions of

micaning or effect of the provisions of section three of this act. Sec. 12.—Every motor vehicle while in use on a public highway, shall be pro-vided with good and efficient brakes and also with a suitable bell, horn, or other signal. And it shall exhibit dur-ing the period from one hour after sun-set to one hour before sunrise, at least two lamps in front showing white

lights, visible within a reasonable dis-tance, in the direction toward which such vehicle is proceeding, and also a red light, visible from the rear of said motor vehicle.
