EASTERN BROKERS
ARE CENSUREDSalt Lake Stock & Mining Ex-
change Members Get Worked
Up Over an Advertisement.

ADOPT WARM RESOLUTIONS.

Disapproving Methods of O. F. Jonn-
son & Co. in Floating an Alta
Company.

A half page advertisement, which appeared in all of the morning papers of this city today, stirred up quite a commotion on the floor of the Salt Lake Stock & Mining exchange during the forenoon calls, and resulted, after the receipt of a rather caustic communication from President James A. Pollock, in the passing of resolutions denouncing in strongest terms the methods employed by O. F. Jonnson & Co., an eastern brokerage firm that has been notably conspicuous in the floating of Nevada stocks, in undertaking to induce the public to buy stock in what is purported to be the West Columbus Copper company with five lode mining claims in the camp of Alta.

Inquiry made by the "News" at the office of the secretary of state this afternoon elicited the information that there is no such concern in legal existence in this state. Notwithstanding this, the advertisement contains the words: "The West Columbus Copper company is incorporated for 400,000 shares at a par value of \$1 a share, of which 125,000 shares have been placed in the treasury to provide funds for the immediate development of this extremely valuable territory."

But worst of all, and which caused mining men interested in Alta to express not a little indignation, was the representation made in a map used in the advertisement referred to, designating the location of the so-called West Columbus ground. Those who are acquainted with the lay of the country in the vicinity of Alta have always understood that the property of the South Columbus Mining company is located on the south and east of the Columbus Consolidated company's domains; but the map which appeared in the morning papers shows that the South Columbus locations had been moved down the canyon, perhaps for convenience sake, and that the West Columbus is represented as being the owner of ground adjoining and further down the canyon.

It was learned during the day, however, from General Manager Tony Jacobson of the Columbus Consolidated company, that a member of the Jonnson firm, who is now in the city, had made arrangements several days ago, with the owners of the Silver Dipper, Alexander Nos. 1 and 2 and Leroy Nos. 1 and 2, to float a company for them, but the property, he states, is located in what is known as the Peruvian gulch section of the camp, about one and a half miles below the old mine, and is not the property of the Jonnson firm.

Pollock's communication. The communication of President Pollock of the Mining Exchange reads as follows:

"I wish to call the attention of the members of the exchange to an advertisement of O. F. Jonnson & Co., published in the Salt Lake morning papers this date, in which the following statement occurs:

"We especially call attention to the fact that any member of the Salt Lake Stock & Mining exchange will be glad to execute your orders for the purchase of this security and will undoubtedly recommend and advise the purchase of this stock."

"This statement is unauthorized by either official or individual action of the members of the exchange, and is an inexcusable assumption on the part of the advertiser, deserving criticism of methods that should receive the unqualified disapproval of this exchange as a body."

"I therefore request the members assembled, to signify their approval of this communication and to request the widest publication by the press of the fact that the Salt Lake Stock & Mining exchange in no wise permits the use of its name for private gain."

MILL FOR SHEBA.

Directors Will Build a New 100-Ton
Plant.

The board of directors of the Sheba Mining company, operating in Humboldt county, Nev., have decided to build a mill, of 100-ton capacity. The plant is to contain two units of 50 tons each.

Money obtained from the pending assessment will be used partially for this purpose.
