PRESIDENT TAYLOR'S TOUR.

Through courtesy of Secretary L. J. Nuttall, we are enabled to furnish a synopsis of the recent tour made by Presidents John Taylor and Geo. Q. Cannon, with a party, through settlements of Cache, Bear Lake, Rich, Summit, Wasatch and Utah Stakes, from which they returned to this city yesterday morning. On the 29th ult., the First Presidency, with Apostles Wilford Woodruff, Lorenzo Snow, F. D. Richards and John H. Smith, and a number of brethren and sisters, left for Logan City, to attend the Cache Stake Conference, held there on the 30th and 31st. They reached their destination at 10.20 p.m., and on the following day (Saturday), the Conference commenced. In the morning, the meeting was addressed by Apostle John H. Smith and President Wilford Woodruff, and in the afternoon by three returned missionaries and Apostle F. D. Richards. After the services had concluded, President Taylor and party visited the Logan Temple and ascended to the roof, which was just being finished. The Conference resumed next morning, when President Joseph F. Smith addressed the congregation, and the Church authorities were presented and sustained. The afternoon was partially occupied by President George Q. Cannon, who read from the Doctrine and Covenants a portion of the vision of Joseph and Sidney, and also part of the 4th chapter of Revelations. Upon these texts, President Taylor delivered a discourse and was followed by President Cannon. On Monday morning, President Joseph F. Smith, with Apostles Lorenzo Snow, F. D. Richards and John H. Smith, returned home, leaving a party of ten persons to continue the proposed journey northward. Apostle Woodruff was detained at Logan by illness. On Monday, Presidents Taylor and Cannon again visited the Temple and gave certain directions concerning the completion of the roof, and on Tuesday the party got an early start for Bear Lake. Proceeding in carriages up Logan Canyon they dined at the Temple Saw Mills and drove over to Meadowville, where they arrived at 6 p. m. From Logan, a distance of 36 miles, they were accompanied by Presidents W. B. Preston, C. O. Card and W. W. Taylor, the latter having arrived from Salt Lake prior to the departure from Logan. At Meadowville, a programme of travel was arranged, and on Wednesday morning Presidents Budge and Osmond with others arrived from Paris, and a meeting was held at 10 a. m., at which the speakers were Presidents Cannon, Preston and Taylor. Elder Card and teams then returned to Logan; and the main company at 1.40 p. m. started for Garden City. Meeting was held there at 3 p. m., and addressed by Presidents Taylor and Cannon. The journey was then resumed to St. Charles, through a region abounding in orchards, laden

At 7.40 Elders Gibbs and Nuttall and President Cannon preached at Woodruff, and on Wednesday the party reached Evanston. Here they parted with the brethren from Bear Lake, and took the train for Echo, where they were met by President Cluff with carriages. Elder Nuttall and President Cannon addressed a congregation at Coalville that night during which Apostle Erastus Snow arrived from Salt Lake. The brass band gave the party a serenade in the evening. Thursday morning Presidents Taylor and Cannon and Apostle Snow spoke at a meeting, and at 1.30 p. m. the latter returned to Salt Lake, while the others visited Wanship and met with the Saints of that place. A meeting was held at Peoa on Friday, and on Saturday at Kamas. Saturday afternoon the party, having been met by President Hatch and Elder Clyde, with vehicles, left for Heber City. Meetings were held there at 10 a. m. and 2 p. m. on Sunday, and on Monday Charleston was visited. After dinner at Bishop Murdock's, the party started down Provo Canyon, encountering a heavy rain storm on the way. Passing through Pleasant Grove, they arrived at American Fork at 5.30 p.m. Presidents Cannon and Hatch went on to Lehi and held a meeting, and on Tuesday, at 8 a.m., the entire Salt Lake company boarding, at American Fork, the train upon which Presidents Wilford Woodruff and George Teasdale were returning from the Sanpete Conference, reached this city at 10 a.m., all well and materially improved in health.
