THE REPUBLICAN COMMITTEE.

Jewell Elected Chairman.

New York, 2.—The report of the  
committee on organization has recom-  
mended Governor Jewell, of Connect-  
icut, for chairman, and D. C. Dor-  
sey, of New Haven, as secretary of the  
Republican National Committee.

The following executive committee was  
chosen: Horace Davis, of Califor-  
nia; James B. Debeaux, of Georgia;

John A. Logan, of Illinois; John C.  
New, of Indiana; John S. Run-  
nett, of Iowa; John A. Martin, of  
Kansas; Henry C. Warmoth, of  
Louisiana; John M. Forbes, of Mass-  
achusetts; Chauncy L. Fiske, of  
Michigan; William B. Chandler, of  
New Hampshire; George A. Hazley,  
of New Jersey; Thomas C. Platt, of  
New York; W. P. Canaday, of North  
Carolina; William E. Cooper, of  
Ohio; Jos. Cameron, of Pennsylvania;  
George W. Hooker, of Vermont;  
W. H. Mason, of West Virginia;  
Elihu Enos, of Wisconsin; R. C.  
McCormick, of Arizona; Stephen B.  
Elkins, of New Mexico.

A resolution was passed calling for  
a meeting of the National Com-  
mittee on the 14th of October, when the  
resolution proposed at last night's  
meeting will be acted upon.

The executive committee was orga-  
nized by electing Marshall Jewell  
as chairman, S. W. Dorsey as secre-  
tary, and Col. Geo. W. Hooker, of  
Vermont, as assistant secretary.

Horace Davis, was named as mem-  
ber for California, of the Western  
division, and executive committee  
headquarters in Chicago. The divi-  
sion will be under the charge of  
General Logan. Governor Jewell  
and Secretary Dorsey were empow-  
ered to select permanent headquarters  
for the committee.

The committee was addressed by  
Messrs. Canaday, North Carolina,  
Hicks, Florida, Lee, South Carolina,  
and Dorsey, of Arkansas. Jewell  
noted that the time for the next  
meeting of the executive committee  
will be fixed as follows: August 5th,  
September 9th and October 14th;

Logan, having vacated the chair,  
then moved that the chairman and  
secretary of the executive committee  
be instructed to prepare and let  
issue a circular embodying the laws  
governing eligibility of electors;  
adopted.

A motion was adopted, made by  
R. C. McCormick, to the effect that  
a sub-committee of three, to which  
the Executive Committee be advised, be  
appointed for consultation with the  
Executive Committee in reference to  
matters pertaining to the cam-  
paign, to report at the next meeting of  
the Executive Committee. This  
committee consists of the chairman,  
Jewell, the secretary, Dorsey, R.  
McCormick, G. W. Hooker and J.  
B. Devere. It was stated that there  
was a personal desire on all hands  
that Mr. Blaine should visit the  
Pacific Coast and Oregon. Resolu-  
tion that a formal invitation be  
extended by the committee to  
Blaine to do so. This motion was  
carried. The Executive Committee  
then adjourned.

A motion was adopted, made by  
R. C. McCormick, to the effect that
