Chelsea is in ashes. The recent blaze has prostrated the town and many heart-rending scenes have followed in its wake. Several were burned to death and many injured. Refugees are to be seen along all the streets guarding their household goods which had been removed from out of the fire's path. The property loss is estimated at \$5.000,000.
