### STATE MENTAL HOSPITAL.

Annual Report Filed With Gov. Cutler By Supt. Calder.

The annual report of the state mental hospital for the year ending Nov. 30, 1995, has been filed with Gov. Cutler by Supt. D. H. Calder. The total number of pa-

D. H. Calder. The total number of pa-tients treated at the hospital during the year was 405, the average number was 394 and the number in the hospital at the close of the year was 379. There were 71 patients discharged dur-ing the year and 25 died. The death rate for the year and 25 died. The death rate for the year based on the total number in the hospital was 6.1 per cent and the rate as based upon the average number ia the institution was 6.3 per cent. The report shows that the average cost of keeping the patients was 24.3 cents per day.

But when once he received his right bearings, he sailed in the face of every wind and wave. Here Dr. Talmage read a por-tion of the fourteenth chanter of first Corinthians, and said he hoped if he spoke in an anknown tongue, his first Corinthians, and said he hoped if he spoke in an anknown tongue, his listeners would have the spirit of inter-pretation. The message of "Mormon-ism" to the world is in no uncertain words, yet it is so plain and simple that a wayfaring man though a fool may understand it. "Mormonism" de-clares that all earth's inhabitants are sons and daughters of God, not here by chance, but having a glorlous des-tiny in view. The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints teaches that the second advent of the Son of Man is near, even at the door. In this Church the revelation from on high is again heard, and it, the Church, is a repository of the Holy Priesthood. Elder Taimage said he had the great-est respect for the religious views and the church of his friend and neighbor, and he had no thought that those who and he had no thought that those who did not believe as he believed would go straight to the orthodox hell. In the Father's house are many mansions, many degrees of glory, and each soul will find its proper place, will receive its merited reward or deserved punishment.

The book of Mor-mon, which the Saints believe to be the word of God, distinctly says that no king shall bear sway upon this-the land of promise. This soil is not pro-ductive of such plants as kings and ductive of such plants as kings and monarchs. Partisanship should not prevail, con-

tiqued Dr. Taimage, to the extent that it does. When the voice of the major-ity has spoken, even the defeated should join in working for the welfare of the nation. Those who oppose the head of this great nation, work against the Amighty More religion in polihead of this great nation, work against the Aonighty. More religion in poli-tics would insure a greater degree of horescy between man and man, and would do away with all graft. The speaker argued that a system which taught him that he must act honestly and honorably with his fellowmen re-ligiously, but permitted him to do as he pleased politically, was not a propage pleased politically, was not a proper moral code.
