Telegraphic Orders Given From Washington to Engage Nine Pacific Mail Company's Steamers.

Vessels Can Transport an Army of 10,000 Men to Manila.—The Number of American Troops is Regarded as Sufficient to Garrison the Place and Hold the Islands for the U. S.

The present plan is to take for this work all the National Guard from California, Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Nevada, Colorado and the Far Western States generally, with the Hawaiian Guard of Regular Infantry and Cavalry, and of other troops engaged on the Volcanoes—Up to 20,000 men, but the exact number is not yet determined.

Washington, May 4.—Telegraphic orders were sent from Washington to San Francisco to engage nine steamers of the Pacific Mail Company, which could transport within a week an army of 10,000 men, and which have also been made arrangements to supply the fleet with coal.
