FIRST DISTRICT COURT.

Grand Jury Exposed—For He-Facilities—Nets.

After the First district court opened Monday morning, the following grand jury was empaneled for the September term: James Hutchinson, Spanish Fork; George J. W. Fronshorn, Fillmore; A. G. Judge Smith instructed the jury to regard to their oaths, and cautioned them against holding themselves in court too long, as it would be a burden upon the officers and a source of expense which should be avoided by civil suits.
