

Phoenix, Ariz, Oct. 19.—The days and nights of frequent rains, some of them downpours, have placed the Sali river and its tributaries in a flood stage again. Early this morning about 17,000 again. Early this morning about 12,000 fuctors of water, flooding the river from Pinal creek, 20 miles above Roosevell, submerged the hig storage dam under construction at Roosevell, evering three tumerase derrinks and other ma-chlnery, and stopping work. This afternoon another flood poured in from Tonto creek, a mile above the dam. Sikry miles below the Verds dver began emptying the flood waters.
