The Sacred Cubit.

Our attention has been drawn to an error in relation to the length of the sacred cubit, as it was given in an article on the Book of Abraham, on Saturday last, in the Evening News. The sacred cubit is there stated to be 25.025, instead of which it should be 25.025, meaning 25 inches and a fraction over. In our article on the Pyramid, on the 20th of December last, it was stated that "the pyramid is 1001 of the inch at present in use." The pyramid unit was the one five hundred millionth of the length of the earth's axis; twenty-five of these units constituted the length of the sacred cubit.

With regard to the "procession

of the equinoxes," this alludes to

the falling back of the sun from

its apparent place in the hea-

vens, as seen in relation

to any particular star. We all

know that the sun is much higher

in the heavens at mid-day in win-

ter than it is at mid-day in sum-

mer; and that when the sun is ex-

actly half way between these two

extreme positions is the time of

equinox, when the days and

nights are of equal length. When

this happens, if the sun is seen

along with any particular star, the

following year when the moment

of equinox happens, the sun will

not be with the same star, but a

little more than 50 seconds (50.17)

of a degree west of it. This will

happen every year, and the course

of the equinox is westward, around

a great circle of the heavens; and

it is a great circle which takes a period

of 25,568 years.
