

## A LITTLE BILL OF EXPENSE.

A writer in Spain has exhumed from the old records a little bill of expenses rendered by the Spanish Gondolas de Corva to King Ferdinand, after the famous battle of Ceriguola. The writer says:

Fifty thousand ducats for brandy distributed to the army on the day of the battle.

One million ducats for thanksgiving masses.

Three million ducats for masses for the dead.

Eight hundred thousand ducats for spies.

And lastly, one hundred million ducats in compensation for my patience in listening to a cheese-paring king, who demands accounts from a man who has presented him with a kingdom.
