New York, Oct. 14.-Leading diamond New York, Oct. 14.—Leading diamond merchants in this city have received ca-bled advices from their brokers in London, Amsterdam and Antwerp that the diamond selling syndicate of the De Beers company of South Afri-ca has advanced the price on all small "rough" goods 5 per cent, and the price of the larger rough diamond 10 per cent. The syndicate handles the output of the De Beers company, which produces, it is said, about 95 per cent of the total output of the world. The advance is the third since Feb-ruary, and diamonds were then selling higher than they have been at any time since the consolidation of the South Af-
