Lake City, at the April Conference in 1853. Work on the building soon be-gan and has been continued with per-severance and regularity, and now the walls of the

tower aloft to the sky, a monument of the skill, industry, ambition, and lofty and noble purposes of the Saints. This building as it now atsnds is a monument of architectural skill and beauty and the admiration of travelers. Hundreds of thousands of dollars have been expended in carrying the work on to its present condition, and it will take a vast amount of labor to complete it. But when finished it will be an object of constant joy to the Latter-day Saints.

At the time the foundation of this magnificent structure was laid it required more than man's wisdom to foresee the growth and progress that would be made by the people in this region. President Young displayed a wisdom in laying the plans for the Sait Lake Temple which is remarkable. The rapid development of the valleys of these mountains and the numerous settlements which have been established, demonstrate the great breadth of that wisdom.

This grand temple is nearing completion at a time when such a building is snitable to the wants of the people, and a fitting ornament of their CHIEF CITY

The exodus from Illinois proved in a short time the wisdom of this utterance of the Apostles at the memorable conference held in the Nanvoo Temple in October, 1845. In this then desolate country the Saints had peace, time and room to establish settlements. They had to endure many privations in the pioneer work, but were greatly blessed of the Lord. Settlements in a few years dotted the land in many places, in various directions from Salt Lake City. This rapid growth of the people demanded, the erection of temples in other places than Salt Lake in order to meet the requirements of the Saints in tilling their great mission upon the earth.

On March 10, 1873, the foundation rock for a temple 141 feet 8 Inches by 93 feet 4 inches was laid in St. George, a settlement in southern Utah, located in an extremely rocky, barren region, sparsely settled. Certain portions of this temple were dedicated on the 1st of January, 1877, and at the April conference of the Church, held that year at St. George, the temple proper was dedicated. The temple stands in that land a marvel, a wonder to all who see it. It comes upon the view like an

and conspicuously marks an era of prosperity in the history of the Church. It is estimated to have cost \$800,000. On the 25th day of the same month that recorded the completion of the St. George Temple, the site for the Manti Temple was dedicated and the ground broken. The Manti Temple is 172x95 feet. It is located on a hill, and terrace work leads to it. Thousands of dollars were spent in preparing the foundation of this structure. The Manti Temple is of unique architecture and is nearing completion. The people in the district where it is located are generous in their donations, earnest in their labors and therefore look forward with anticipation of great joy at its dedication.

The year that recorded the dedication of the St. George Temple and of the Manti Temple ground, also witnessed the dedication of the ground was dedicated May 17th, 1877, and the corner stones were laid September 17th of the same year. The building, which is 171 by 95 feet, was dedicated on the 17th of May, 1884.

is \$550,000. This Temple is located on a bench in the eastern part of Logan City and commands a flue view of most of the settlements of Cache Valley.

The sites of the Independence, Kirtland, Far West and Nauvoo temples were selected during the lifetime of the Prophet Joseph, and those of the Sait Lake, St. George, Manti and Logan temples were chosen under the presidency of Brigham Young. Drivings, mobblings and exteme trials through persecution marked the era of the latter. The spirit of hatred toward the Saints continued but it was manifested in a different way.
