The Prosecution Endeavor to Prove that They are Conspirators.

THE TRIAL OF O'BRIEN.

Conceded for the Crown will Prove Conspiracy.

DILLON, Sept. 25.—Roman, counsel for the Crown, asked permission of the court to make a slight alteration in the charges against the prisoners.

The latter protested vigorously, saying that it was illegal. The court said he need not do so, but permitted the desired change.

Roman then reviewed the instances which had led to the time when the plan of campaign was put in force on the Smith-Harry case at Tippecanoe, May 19, and he proceeded to present evidence to prove the conspiracy on the part of the defendants from the time down to the time when the arrests were made.

The defendants protested against the introduction of evidence touching matters anterior to the date specified in the warrants. The court decided that the prosecution might produce testimony of a general character to prove the existence of a conspiracy prior to the date given in the warrants, but that no evidence could be permitted concerning acts of the defendants done anterior to the date mentioned in the warrants.

After the court had given the decision in the matter of the protests, Roman, in behalf of the crown, continued to recount the events that occurred in 1889 in connection with the carrying out of the plan of campaign.

He declared the whole thing a sham, and demanded that the counsel for the crown come to the particular acts with which the defendants were charged.

Roman protested that it was entirely out of his power to share the proceedings.

Alfred Dillon of Dublin appeared for a moment against the prosecution, and then withdrew.

The magistrate, in his concluding remarks, declared that the evidence was sufficient to justify the arrest of the defendants, and that the case would be tried at a later date.

The excitement which followed the arrest of Dillon and O'Brien was made his counterpart in the national election today. The district court today created a profound sensation.

The fact that John Morley is present at the trial is considered a subject of much curiosity. It is thought that the trial will be more interesting than the trial of the Irish prisoners in their case of last year.

A local police attack was made on Keating, proprietor of the Limerick Inn, who was severely injured. It is thought that the attack was made by the police.

An editorial in the News says: "On this occasion the presence of Morley has given an interest to the trial which is not common to trials of this kind."
