The board of county commissioners has received a new omnibus truck for the county treasurer's office. The truck was constructed by the Art Metal Construction company of St. Louis, and is the best of its kind.

At the Ladies' Literary club this evening Prof. F. C. Hicks, the celebrated economist and sociologist, will deliver his famed lecture on "The Distribution of Wealth." The lecture will be given under the auspices of the Economic league of this city.

Postmaster Thomas and Inspector M. M. Steele on their return last evening from Taylorville were well satisfied with the proposition to improve the free delivery system in that vicinity. The routes proposed for American Fork and Provo will be next considered.

On investigating the death of John S. McDonald, the miner, which occurred very suddenly at Sandy Thursday night, County Attorney Christensen concluded that the unfortunate man came to his end by natural causes, and therefore ordered that no inquest be held.

Rev. Geo. H. Reese, formerly pastor of the Hill M. E. church, has been transferred to Kansas and preaches his last sermon tomorrow morning. His subject is "Spiritual Forces Back of Physical Forces." He lectures at the First M. E. church next Tuesday night on "The Possible Man."
