FRY—In the 15th Ward, Salt Lake City, January 7th, 1883, of old age, Elizabeth Fry, aged 82 years. She obeyed the Gospel in Stockland Parish, England, about 25 years ago, and emigrated to Utah eleven years since. She died in full faith of the Gospel.

OBITUARY.

At Tempe, Maricopa County, Dec. 17, 1882, of Bright's disease, after an illness of five weeks, Elder Joseph Ellis Johnson, who was born on the 28th of April, 1817, in Pomfret, Chautauque County, State of New York, and received the Gospel in 1831. In early youth he emigrated to Kirtland, Ohio, and in 1833 assisted in building the Kirtland Temple. With the Kirtland Camp started for Missouri in 1838; taught school in 1839, in Springfield, Ill. Went to Nauvoo in 1840 and was married to his first wife in 1841. Participated in all the troubles at Kirtland and Nauvoo. Accompanied Joseph and Hyrum to the Carthage Jail and was afterwards taken prisoner by the mob. He moved to Council Bluffs in 1848 where he was postmaster for five years. In 1852 he established the Council Bluffs Eagle and was elected to the Iowa Legislature. In 1857 he published the Crescent City Oracle, a 4d afterwards the Huntman's Echo, at Wood River Centre, Neb. In 1861 he came to Utah and served in the Legislature of 1862, and in 1863 published the Farmer's Oracle at Spring Lake Villa, Utah County. In 1855 was called on a mission to St. George, where he published the Utah Pomologist and other periodicals for a number of years.

His botanical research gave his name to the world in connection with new and rare plants discovered and introduced by himself. His gardens, of which Utah had reason to be proud, embraced the choicest fruits and plants from almost every clime. By his importation, Utah is greatly enriched and beautified. With his whose soul he labored to develop natural resources, and to inspire with a love for the beautiful hearts of the people whose affection will long remain the best monument to his worth.

He was again called by the Presidency to assist in establishing a colony in Southern Arizona or Northern Mexico, associated with his brother Benjamin F. Johnson, to which he cheerfully responded, arriving at Tempe with a portion of his family on the 23rd of July last, since which, until the time of his sickness, he labored both spiritually and temporally for the object of his mission, giving the fullest assurance through the period of his sickness, of his faith, not only in the principles, but in the ordinances of the Gospel, and died in the bright hopes of a reward with the just.

He honored the law of celestial marriage and leaves three companions, who are the mothers of 29 children, 17 of whom are living together with many grandchildren, all of whom with a multitude of relatives and friends will deeply mourn his loss.
He was buried at Mesa City, eight miles from Tempe, to which place the corpse was followed by from 10 to 15 vehicles filled with mourners, and all seemed to vie in their manifestations of kindness and respect.
