Idaho Crop Bulletin.

Weather crop bulletin No. 18 of the Idaho State Weather Service for the week ending Monday, August 3, 1895.

The weather of the past week was unusually warm with hot, dry winds over nearly the entire state. In some portions of the state very light showers were reported, accompanying scattered thunderstorms. In the few places where the rainfall was not sufficient to be of any material benefit to crops, rain is needed for irrigation in all sections. Meadow grass, dry corn, and maize in the range areas and shrub belt are the principal places being dried up or becoming droughty.

Insects and vermin in the southern section, and grasshoppers and crickets in the northern section of the state are still doing some damage to crops.

Early wheat has advanced rapidly during the week and in some of the western and northern counties it is being cut; in the eastern section it is still green with the exception of a few hills ready for harvesting. It is now nearly ripe, some of the early grain is being cut for hay owing to serious damage from late frost. The last frost of the season was on July 26 and did only fairly well. One frost is enough to stop and promises a good crop.

Cultivators have made rapid progress and are in a very promising condition; in some parts of the state where frost was heavy, the crop is poor, but in the hill sections, Owyhee, etc., an average crop of grain and truck is promised over the greater portion of the state.

The second crop of alfalfa is growing well and coming in in some instances. The grain crop "well," an abundant yield is predicted.
