The regular quarterly conference of Millard Stake of Zion was held in the Bowery in Fillmore City, Sat-urday and Sunday, July 2d and 3d,

Bishop B. Bennet of Frisco, Beaver Stake was called and spoke a short time, referring to the fact that a ward organization had been effected a few days ago by the Apostles Lyman and Smith in that place.

Spoke also of the unceasing labors of the other members of the Quorum of the Twelve and the First Presidency, each according to his Presidency, each according to his health and strength. Said each Stake organization was like a little community in itself, so that the constant presence of the Apostles is not

stant presence of the Apostles is not necessary.

In the afternoon the Sacrament was administered, the General Authorities of the Church and the Presidency of Millard Stake were presented by J H. Smith and the Local Authorities by E. Partridge; all were unanimously sustained.

Apostle F. M. Lyman then addressed the people, and although he complained of his lungs feeling tired on account of so much speaking on this trip, he spoke at considerable length and with much power on various subjects, viz: Priesthood and the different callings and positions in the Church, Celestial Marriage and sealing by the "Holy Spirit of Promise." To marry more than one wife in the flesh is the crowning trial, without which a man never can fully learn to know his wife nor the fully learn to know his wife nor the wife her husband, and if anyone flatters himself that he can slide along and avoid that trial, and yet obtain the highest glory in the kingdom of God, he deceives himself. He also warned the brethren of the Priesthood against misusing their authority, and read from the Book of Doctrine and Covenants, page 386, "Many are called but few are chosen, etc.


Apostle John H. Smith, endorsed all that Brother Lyman had said, and made some further remarks on Celestial Marriage, Prayer, etc.


