MCCORMICK'S STRONG TALK.

Banker W. S. McCormick is one Salt Lake citizen who does not believe that the management of the exchange has always been conducted along lines that would inspire confidence among investors. "There have been times," the great financier said, "when certain stocks have been called which were not called for the purpose of the exchange, but for the purpose of the market."

But the practice indulged in of "shorting" stocks, I am of the opinion, is the most disastrous thing that could possibly happen to destroy the confidence of the investing public.

But as regards the listing of industrial stocks Mr. McCormick said he did not believe the effect would be to increase the value of stocks. "As a rule," he continued, "people who buy this class of stocks, usually do so for an investment, not to speculate in."

Generally speaking, they are not changed as readily as other classes of stocks. I am not sure that the various corporations will think so favorable of the market that they will be inclined to pay over to the exchange the listing fee provided for in its rules.
