

SALT LAKERS IN GOTHAM.

Farewell to Agnes Rose Lane, Former President of the Relief Society—Spencer Clawson, Jr., Arrives from Europe—Miss Blanche Thomas at Work with "Bonnie Brier Bush" Co.

New York, Aug. 24.—Monday evening, at the home of Mr. B. F. Cummings on 129th street west, a testimonial and farewell party was given under the auspices of the New York Relief society of the Latter-day Saints, in honor of Agnes Rose Lane, previous to her marriage, on the 16th of September. Mrs. Sloan, Miss Phyllis Thatcher, Mr. Best, Mr. Easton and Miss Lillian Bollow made up the musical program, which was especially good. Elders Holt and Taylor were also on the program, and Miss Lane, at the request of her friends, gave a recitation. At the conclusion of the exercises, she was presented with a beautiful autograph album, by Mrs. B. F. Cummings, president of the Relief society, on behalf of the members, who had each inscribed a sentiment or verse,

expressing the regard felt for Miss Lane in the Brooklyn conference. The album was a very handsome token, and the recipient very feelingly expressed her thanks for the kind remembrance. For nearly three years Miss Lane was president of the Relief society, but her professional duties as an actress kept her out of New York most of the time. Mrs. Catherine Lane, who was first counselor, acting as president in her absence. The wedding cards are out, and every member of the conference will be an honored guest. Miss Lane will read the paper Sunday evening, at the Relief society meeting, which will in all probability be the last time she will take part in this city; her home for the future will be in Atlanta, Ga.

Spencer Clawson, Jr., arrived from Europe on the Commonwealth, Saturday, Aug. 22, after a very stormy voyage, the steamer being in the wake of the hurricane that visited the West Indies. Every passenger felt the effects

of the storm, and one day only three persons were able to make an appearance in the dining room. It is four years next month since Elder Clawson left home for a mission to Germany. His first labored in Hanover, Stuttgart and Hamburg, under Presidents Schultess and Hugh J. Cannon, and in Leipzig under President Heppner, who presided over that branch later. President Heppner, later put Elder Clawson in charge of the Leipzig branch. For nearly three years he was in the mission field, and for the last year he has been a student of the piano in Vienna, Austria. Elder Clawson returns in good health and spirits, having enjoyed his labors in the mission, and his work in Vienna. He had been released to go home just before the last serious trouble with the German government in relation to the Elders preaching there, but he is warm in his praise of the tact and wisdom displayed by President Hugh J. Cannon during the unpleasantness. Like many others he believes through President Cannon's affability and influence, Mr. Lane will yet be resumed there on a firmer basis than before. Elder Clawson leaves Monday evening for his home in Utah.

President Welling, with his first counselor, Wm. Stevens, has been visiting Newark and Jersey City, and Oceanville, L. I., holding meetings and arousing the interest of the people by their energy and enthusiasm, qualities which have mark-

ed the progress of this conference under President Welling's management.

Mr. Harold Goff, who has been attending the summer school of elocution under Prof. Clark at Chautauque, paid New York city a short visit last week, previous to returning home Monday, Aug. 24. Mr. Goff is a brother of Elder George Goff, who presided over the Brooklyn conference for over a year, and who made himself very popular with strangers as well as with the people among whom he labored.

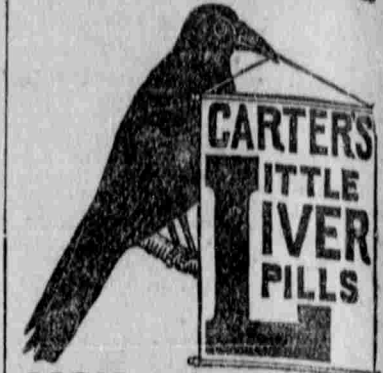
