TOTALLY DESTROYED.

A Store and Dancing Hall Burned to  
the Ground Near Liberty Park,  
This Morning.

A fire alarm was sent in to the main-  
taining office at 2:15 this morning. The  
brigade rolled out on foot and made a  
quick run to the scene of the blaze, which was at the corner of Sixth  
East and Ninth South streets near  
Liberty Park, in a one-story frame  
structure about 30x40 in size. The  
building was the property of a man  
named McMillan, and was used as a  
dancing hall and concert-histry store.  
The fire had progressed so far before  
the alarm was given that it was  
impossible to save the building with its contents  
undamaged. It was a total loss and will  
reach from \$1200 to \$1500. There was  
no insurance.

"It is absolutely impossible for the  
fire to have been caused by accident  
or carelessness, as the building was  
entirely destroyed by fire," said  
John C. H. Smith, who was on the  
scene of the fire. "The building  
had been in existence for over  
a year, and there was no  
possibility of its being destroyed  
by lightning or fire."

## DEATH OF SUSAN S. YOUNG.

She Passed Quietly to Her Last

Afternoon.

Sister Susan Emily Young, widow  
of the late President Brigham Young  
died at her residence—the Lion House,  
Salt Lake City—at 1:30 p.m., Novem-  
ber 20th, 1862.

Drowned was the daughter of Henry  
and Mary Bailey, and was born in  
Shenandoah county, Virginia, October  
20th, 1841. She was unusually  
handsome at the time of her death.  
The family moved from Virginia to Salt  
Lake City, Utah, where they resided  
when the Elders of the Church first  
visited that state. The Noyles re-  
sided at the temple under the adminis-  
tration of Brigham Young, who was then  
in his youth, soon after embracing  
the Gospel they left Pennsylvania for  
Utah, where they expected to join the  
main body of the Saints. The Elmer  
were, however, driven out of Mis-  
souri about that time and soon after  
established the city of Navas. The  
nively family located for some time at  
Springfield, Illinois, and sub-  
sequently removed to Navas, the  
whole place, in the year 1844, her  
dear son was married to President  
Young's daughter, Elizabeth. The  
couple suffered greatly in the ex-  
odus from Navas to the West, and  
the winter of 1846-47 was spent in  
the building of their home in Salt  
Lake Valley.

Her husband died in 1851, leaving  
her a widow. She was a member of

follower of the principles of the  
Gospel.
