## WEATHER CONDITIONS.

A great area of high pressure covers the country east of the Mississippi river. The low pressure is north of Montana, where the barometer reads 29.75 inches. A slight depression appears over the upper lake region, and also over the southwestern part of Arizona. Precipitation has fallen at Abilene, Moorhead and Winnipeg, and snow was falling at Huron and Chicago at the hour of observation. It is colder over the northern Rocky Mountain slope, and warmer over the lower Missouri Valley.

## LOCAL BRIEFS.

It is said that W. S. McCornick may become a candidate for U. S. Senator from Utah.

Architect Kletting is building a \$10,000 addition to the Sweetwater brewery at Green River, Wyoming.

M. J. Langley has been appointed trustee in the case of Mrs. Olga Simon, bankrupt, with bonds at \$200.

The meeting of the National Wool Growers' association in Salt Lake City in January next is attracting considerable attention in the East.

The Sunday school convention on Monday next Tuesday will be a most interesting assemblage. Already the delegates are commencing to arrive in the city.

Bond buyers are keeping an eye on the refunding of the city's bonds with the city on January 1st next and July 1st following.

A piece of property on the west side of State street, being part of lot 7, block 27, plat A, Salt Lake City survey, has been sold by Philip Fugleby Sr. to J. J. Snell for \$3,500.

The Utah Foundry & Machine company is erecting a new plant on East Temple, between Eighth and Ninth South streets, into which it will move in about three weeks. The new building is 37,110 feet, and will cost \$30,000.

A decree of foreclosure was entered yesterday in the Third district court in the case of Charles W. Hordel against Edward S. Dickson and James Campbell. Judgment was rendered by default.

The men on the telephone extension towards Malad have reached Samaria, Ida., and now that settlement is in communication with Ogden and this city. The southern extension reaches Mt. Pleasant today.

The number of inquiries being received by the "News" regarding the Christmas prize story, poem and card, indicate that the competition is creating widespread interest. Those intending to compete should read the details elsewhere.

## THE TABERNACLE RECITALS.

To the Editor:

Again may I crave indulgence while I express a few thoughts upon the divine art—this time apropos of the organ recital in the Tabernacle on Saturday morning last.

I feel myself outside all contests, controversies, competitions or the like in all fields of expression of the beautiful. I care only for the concord of the arts, in music or individual, and therefore take joy in adding a note in harmony with the feast of sweet sounds, which was furnished all those who listened to the numbers given on the occasion referred to.

It is with the greatest pleasure we learn that these recitals are to be continued for some time at least, through the future. They are an instruction, a revelation to the people. Among the mountains one is taught the sacred music; from the heights religion has come; there the devotional sentiment is born. What a privilege indeed to hear the inspired conceptions of the great tone masters rendered upon the noble Tabernacle organ.

The great pipe organ—how it lifts the soul above the dreary and tinsel of the world! how it stirs within the mystic heart of man! Solenn as the sound of ocean's waves, or the wind through a forest of pines, grand, triumphant; tender as the cadence of a flute; wailing as the tones of a clarinet; golden strings—how it teaches the sublime, how it fills all the being and thought with hope; how it voices the pain, the longing, the sadness, the joy that comes with fear of death, the dreams of life and love immortal!

And the voices, too! The singers, joining the charm of music to the character of the younger music.

"Sphere-born, harmonious sisters, voice and verse." So wrote Milton, and so think we. "The temple, the cathedral, the house of worship, wrote Kipling, 'is man's noblest work of art.'"

How sweet, then, to hear therein the tuneful voice uttering melody of note and word, the song of the angels, the praise and prayer. With the art-nerve, one might exclaim, "I trust in the living God, Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, and of all things and creatures, visible and invisible, by the trust in the kindness of His law and the goodness of His work. I will strive to love Him and keep His law and see His work while I live. I trust in the nobility of human nature, in the majesty of its faculties, the fullness of its mercy, and the joy of its love."

A few words concerning the andantino by Lemare, "To My Wife." What purity of passion what exalted devotion, what fervent admiration and adoration breathed through the piece! Surely Adam could have felt no deeper thrill, could have expressed no more depth of love to his given consort. Eve, the first, first looked upon her perfect charms in Eden, long ago.

For the beauty of her and the pleasure these recitals have given us, for one, at least, offer our thanks to those to whom the thanks are due.

Terrible Result of Boys Lighting a Bonfire in a Shed.

## SET THE BUILDING AFIRE.

Boys Run Away, and Presence of the Little Girl Was Unknown to People Who Came to Put Out the Fire.

On the afternoon of the eighth inst., some children were playing in the rear of Hyrum Williams' hotel, in a small shed, in which there was some straw, the smallest child being a girl just turned four years old. One of the boys having a match started a fire in the straw, but the boys were so scared they got out and left the little girl to her fate. An alarm of fire was raised by someone in the vicinity, and not knowing the child was there, the crowd started to extinguish the fire, and found the child in a corner nearly roasted to death. Its little head looked like a potato, taken out of a bonfire. It expired about 10 o'clock. Its name was Emma Williams—twin daughter of Hyrum and Maggie Williams.
