

GAZE AT DEAD KING AND CROWN PRINCE

Thousands of Portuguese Take Last Look at Murdered Sovereign and His Heir.

BODIES CONSTANTLY GUARDED

Queen Amelle Tells How She Tried To Save Her Son From the Assassin's Bullets.

Lisbon, Feb. 9.—Thousands of Portuguese filed slowly through the noble cathedral of San Vicente and gazed for the last time on the faces of their king and crown prince. When their king and crown prince. When their king and crown prince.

All the people who appear some emblem of mourning and in passing the coffin placed beneath them floral offerings, some budding wild flowers from the fields, others simple clusters of violets, and others elaborate crosses of flowers and garlands.

In official circles it is believed that the ceremonies of mourning will not terminate until the end of the month, and perhaps may never occur, as the young king wishes to inaugurate his reign with as little pomp as possible.

Queen Amelle, relating her experiences on the day of the tragedy to an intimate friend, which she had just escaped from death, said: "I spread out my cloak to protect Luiz Philippe, after seeing my husband stretched lifeless on the cushion, and I thought in that fateful moment that at least my son would escape."

The queen added that she would never leave her son Manuel, now king, but would remain at his side, adding with counsel and inspiring him to do his duty and love his people.

The authorities have given permission to the family of the dead king to bury him at night, stipulating, however, that the funeral must be held at night. Special precautions will be taken to prevent the occasion from being taken advantage of to make a revolutionary demonstration.

BURST INTO TEARS OF JOY.

Demonstrations by Cooper Bring Happiness to Persons Who Hadn't Heard in Years.

Boston, Feb. 9.—Some remarkable demonstrations were given in public today by L. T. Cooper, who is introducing for the first time in Boston the preparations which created a sensation in other cities recently visited by him.

As a consequence, when it was learned that he would appear in public, the crowds gathered for his headquarters were crowded, some coming merely to get a glimpse of the man himself, others to test his skill in overcoming disease. As nearly as could be learned the facts in regard to the demonstration were these:

At 2 o'clock in the afternoon the young man agreed to show what one of his remedies would do for deafness, and agreed to make any one present, who was afflicted with deafness hear again in less than three minutes.

TAFT WILL BEAT SENATOR FORAKER

Overwhelming Majority of Delegates to be Chosen Tomorrow Will Be for the Secretary.

WILL CONTROL CONVENTION.

There Will Be Some Opposition, and There May be Contesting Delegations.

Columbus, O., Feb. 9.—Next Tuesday the county primaries, at which delegates to the Republican state convention on March 3 are to be selected, will be held throughout Ohio. An overwhelming majority of these delegates will be in favor of William H. Taft for president and the convention may be unanimously in his favor.

Under a recent decision of the Republican state central committee, it will not be necessary to hold actual primaries unless there is more than one ticket in the field, and in virtue of this ruling, in 52 out of a total of 88 counties in the state, the regular Taft delegates will be chosen merely by the certification of their names.

In the remaining 36 counties primaries will be held, but in only four of these is there opposition to Taft. In but one county, Cuyahoga, in which is the city of Cleveland, does the fight against him show any sign of consequence.

The convention will be attended by 815 delegates, of which number Taft is certain to have 745, almost certain of 753, and his political managers are confident that he will have them all.

POLITICS AND STOCK MARKET

Public Utterances of Certain Persons Held Responsible for Shrinkage of Business.

PROBABLY A DULL SUMMER.

Money is Easy and Hard to Lend—Bear Operations Manifest from Time to Time.

New York, Feb. 9.—Speculative activity in the securities market came almost to a halt last week in the midst of the uncertainties presented by the accumulating evidence of the shrinkage of the business and industries of the country and the symptoms of political activity in the form of public utterances by persons conspicuous in political affairs.

A discouraging effect on active operations in the stock market is argued from this prospect, and a summer of dullness and neglect of the market is looked forward to, which offers little inducement to present speculation on speculative ventures.

The Foraker people have considerable strength in the Sixth and Tenth districts, and the fight in the city of Cleveland for state delegates applies also to the congressional conventions of the Twenty-first district. It is therefore possible that there may be contesting delegates from these three districts, and there seems at present to be no possibility of breaking up a solid delegation for Taft, unless the credentials committee of the national convention sustains one or more of these contests, if they are ever made.
