FRENCH CLUB DECLINES

To Accept the Vanderbilt Automobile Cup Won by Frenchman.

New York, Oct. 18.—A letter is now on its way to the Vanderbilt cup commission from the automobile club of France, and as soon as it is received a racing homologation of the American Automobile association will hold its first meeting since the running of the Vanderbilt race. Baron Adrien de Turckheim, the official representative of the Automobile Club of France at the recent race, declined yesterday that the cup would not be accepted by the French club.

The French club has already declined to promote another Gordon Bennett cup race, he said, and it could not very well accept the Vanderbilt cup under the conditions of holding an event for trophy in France next season.

Baron de Turckheim, who will sail for home today on the "Le Sancy," is understood that the French club would offer suggestions regarding future competitions for the Vanderbilt trophy.
