A SALOON BURGLARIZED.

A Large Amount of Money and Valuable Securities Said to be Stolen.

Between 3 and 4 o'clock yesterday morning the Kentucky Liquor Store, First Ward Street, between First Temple and First East streets, was broken into by thieves and \$100 in coins and a number of valuable securities were taken in.

Entrance was effected through the skylight, the thieves according to the record by means of a ladder negligently left hanging outside.

The store room in which the theft was perpetrated was brilliantly lighted all night, but the safe was closed so as to screen the going from the warehouse to the street, and the door was partially as it entered, without being observed by any one, as far as known.
