PITTSTON.-It is difficult now to estimate the full damage by the explosion, but it is not believed that any of the men who were at work in themine will be recovered alive. On entering the ahamber in which the explosion occurred, fallen rock was first found which lay partly in a car completely and blocking up one side, leaving space on the other just sufficient for a man to force himself through. Some distance further in there was another fall, which completely filled the passage, and bepletely that it will take many hours of most persistent labor to reach them.
