LONDON, 10.—The trial of Mr. Stead, editor of the Pall Mall Gazette, Samp-son Jacques, of the same newspaper, Mrs. Rebecca Jarrett, and Madame Louise Mourry, on the charge of in-decently assaulting Eliza Armstrong, was begun to-day at the Central Criminal Court. The prosecution announced that all the charges against Bramwell Booth had been withdrawn and the conspiracy charged against the deendants had been abandoned. Eliza Armstrong testified regarding the alleged indecent assault on her her evidence so far being a repetition of her former testimony.
